Shorefast receives global attention for our local solutions to economic development. The Opportunity

The Project Management Lead is a new role for Shorefast, working alongside visionary CEO Zita Cobb, to move forward the Community Economics Pilot. This contract will be on Fogo Island, NL or Ottawa, ON or Toronto, ON, and has the possibility of extension beyond the one-year Pilot.

A small team will be assembled for the Community Economics Pilot, with key leaders across the pillars of government, business and community. It will include cross-disciplinary specialists on secondment from professional domains (Finance, Accounting, Public Policy, Technology, Academia and Arts & Humanities).

Together, they will research Fogo Island and other enterprising communities to establish good and best practices and develop innovative financial tools and governance structures to promote local economic development. The Project Lead is a critical resource and will be responsible for holding the frame to help galvanize the diverse team toward the deliverables and timelines for the one-year Pilot.

Key Responsibilities

- Manage the planning and implementation of complex project streams from conception to realization
- Develop and manage project schedules; Liaise with internal and external stakeholders to achieve project milestones; Track project progress and identify any risks to Pilot deliverables or timelines; Anticipate needs of internal/external stakeholders and troubleshoots problems
- Draft, negotiate and manage secondment contracts and partnership agreements in consultation with the CFO; Ensure compliance with all contractual aspects
- Develop detailed budgets and reports; Track expenditures for quarterly financial reconciliation; Recommend budgetary adjustments to CFO in accordance with the Pilot's priorities; Negotiate with a range of internal and external stakeholders to avoid scope creep and deliver the project on time and on budget
- Participate as a Pilot representative on various pan-organization teams as required; Organize and chair Pilot team meetings; Provide support for the Community Economics Advisory Group
- Lead the process of establishing an online presence and platform for the Pilot
- Identify and track Canadian and international community economics players, mapping the landscape and developing a network
- Contribute to the development of government grants and other funding proposals and reports; Collaborate pan-organization to inform marketing and communications strategies
- Provide support to CEO, as required
- Perform other duties as assigned
